State Delegate & Committee Business Meeting; State Convention

DATE: March 17, 2022, 11 am

Meeting began at 11:05 am with President Gracey Ledbetter presiding.

Leanna Sarman, state vice president, read the minutes of the last delegate meeting (2021). Kaitlynn Plummer, Carson Valley, moved to approve the minutes as read. The motion was seconded by Casey Bennett, Ruby Mountain. The motion passed unanimously to approve the 2021 delegate meeting minutes.

Gracey asked delegates to separate into their respective committees. The delegates discussed their committee's work and came to a final resolution on their business.

The delegate body reconvened at 11:35 am to discuss their respective issues.

Committee Reports

ARTICLE III. ZONE STRUCTURE

ARTICLE III. ZONE STRUCTURE
